What Should I Bring?

If you choose to fill out your manure management plan while at the workshop, it will be helpful to bring the information listed below.

- ⇒ Farm maps with individual field information (boundaries, identification, acreage), road names, farm boundaries, soil types, and locations of wells, streams, ponds, & concentrated water flow areas
- ⇒ Current soil test reports
- ⇒ Animal types & numbers
- ⇒ Manure application information (normal application rates based on equipment calibration, season of application, and incorporation)
- ⇒ Crops grown, yield goals, rotation schedule, crops receiving manure
- ⇒ Animal concentration areas (type, locations, description)
- ⇒ Pasture locations & management type
- ⇒ Currently installed best management practices

Did you know that all farms generating/using manure must now have a manure management plan? The revised DEP Manure Management Manual released in October 2011 requires every farm in Pennsylvania that produces or applies manure to develop and implement a written Manure Management Plan (MMP). This includes all agricultural livestock operations, down to just one cow, one horse, a couple sheep, etc. If you are unsure if your operation falls under this category, please call the Conservation District today.
