EVERGREENS**(Bundles of 25 = \$17.00)**

Norway Spruce (*Picea abies*)**18-24"**

Fastest growing spruce. Short-needed tree with deep green color. Good Christmas tree, ornamental and reforestation use.

Scotch Pine (*Pinus sylvestris*)**10-16"**

Usually reach a height of 40 to 50 feet and a spread of 30 feet. Their needles are blue green in the summer and usually 1 to 2 inches long. The needles will often change color in the winter, turning more of a yellow green. The bark is orange and peels away from the trunk and branches in an attractive pattern.

Colorado Blue Spruce (*Picea Pungens glauca*)**18-22"**

One of the finest trees for Christmas tree, ornamental and windbreak use. Color ranges from blue-green to silvery blue. Seedlings are grown from the very finest seed collection areas available. This provides you with superb color, excellent shape and a good growth rate.

Victoria Root - Heirloom variety. Slender red/green stalks can be harvested after the first year. Excellent for cooking and baking.

Jersey Supreme - Early season, high yield, cold hardy, disease resistance.

TREES AND FLOWERING SHRUBS

Butternut - White Walnut (*Juglans cinerea*) \$3.00 18-24"

Nuts resemble Black Walnut, but smaller, with an oily, spicy flavor. Tree is best known for the rich quality of its wood.

Red Oak (*Quercus rubra*) \$3.00ea. 18-24"

Select strain, collected from genetically superior specimens in northwest Pennsylvania. Fast growing oak, maturing with a broad round head, leaves turning to red to reddish brown in Autumn. Will tolerate a wide range of soil types from acid to alkaline. Mature height 75-80 feet.

Buttonbush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*) \$3.00 18-24"

A native to the Eastern United States that will thrive in wet and low-lying areas. Blooms July and August with cream-colored flowers that develop into nutlet type fruits, remaining on into the winter. Matures to 6-12 feet.

Grey Dogwood (*Cornus racemose*) \$3.00 18-24"

Attractive shrub grown as a single tree, dense rounded compact. Creamy white flowers, producing white berries. Tolerates moist or dry soils, sun or shady locations.

Tulip Poplar (*Liriodendron tulipifera*) \$3.00 18-24"

Hardy ornamental and forest tree also known as Yellow Poplar. Pyramidal form, with light green glossy leaves and greenish yellow tulip-shaped flowers. Grows to 90 to 100 feet.

Chinese Chestnut (*Castanea mollissima*) \$3.00ea. 12-18"

Grown in a nursery from seed of selected strain. Hardy, blight-resistant, fast growing tree which bears nuts slightly larger than the now extinct American Chestnut. Plant two or more for pollination. Height at maturity about 30-35 feet.

Produces large easy to pick clusters of bright - red fruit. Good quality. Vigorous and hardy.

Consort Black Currant \$5.00 ea. 18-24”

Vigorous Black, very productive, ripens midseason

POTTED PLANTS

Willow, Dappled (Salix integra) \$4.00 ea.

Height and spread reach 3 to 5 feet. Its main attraction is the tri-color leaves of white, green and pink. We advise periodic trimming to maintain leaf variegation. Tolerates wet conditions. Leaf color stays better in full sun.

Rhododendron Dwarf PJM Lavender \$4.00 ea.

Height and spread 3 to 6 feet. A semi-dwarf rhododendron with small evergreen foliage. Small bright lavender pink flowers in early spring. Compact growth habit, will not get out of hand. Good for under low windows.

Sky Pencil Holly (Ilex crenata) \$4.00 ea.

A rather slender, columnar shaped, densely branched evergreen growing to a height of 6 to 8 feet but only 1 ½ to 2 feet wide. The leaves are lustrous, dark green, slightly convex to 1 3/8 inches long and 4/5 inch wide. Female plants produce small greenish flowers in spring that bees and butterflies love. Inconspicuous, tiny, black berries develop in September or October which the birds are sure to gobble up. Sun or shade adaptable. Prefers light, moist, well drained, acidic soil. Drought tolerant. No pruning needed to maintain its remarkable shape.

Black Eyed Susan (Rudbeckia fulgida'Goldsturm') \$3.00 ea.

A very vigorous and compact variety of Black-Eyed Susan, with exceptionally bright golden flowers, July into fall. Height and spread 2 to 2 1/2 feet. Easily reseeds. Seeds attract wild birds, a favorite of wild turkeys. Spectacular in mass plantings, use along fences, driveways, walks, property boundaries.

Purple Coneflower (Echinacea purpurea) \$3.00 ea.

A very robust perennial. This plant grows to a height of 24 to 36 inches tall with a spread of 12 to 18 inches. The large, daisy-like flowers grow on sturdy stems ranging in height from 3 to 5 feet. The flower petals range in color from purple to lavender. The seed center is a large, orange-copper colored cone that is hard and prickly. Blooms all summer and into autumn. Plant in full sun or partial shade. Prefers well drained fertile soil, but is drought tolerant and adaptable to heat, poor soils and high humidity. Maintenance free. A butterfly favorite. Goldfinches and other birds love to feast on the seeds in winter.

Daylily (Hemerocallis 'Stella d'Oro') \$3.00 ea.

A wonderful repeat blooming dwarf daylily. Golden yellow flowers with darker throat all summer. Height 12 inches.
