EVERGREENS**(Bundles of 25 = \$16.50)**

Norway Spruce (Picea abies)**10-18"**

Fastest growing spruce. Short-needed tree with deep green color. Good Christmas tree, ornamental and reforestation use.

White Spruce (Picea glauca)**10-18"**

Very hardy, compact tree with short blue-green needles. Fast rate of growth for Christmas trees, ornamentals and windbreaks. Tolerates wide variety of soils.

White Pine (Pinus strobus)**6-12"**

Soft blue-green needles 3-5" long. Fast growth with excellent needle retention. Desirable for Christmas trees, ornamentals, and reforestation.

Douglas Fir (Pseudotsuga menziessi glauca)**10-18"**

Excellent demand as a Christmas tree or an ornamental. Extremely fast growth, superb needle retention and soft, 1" blue-green needles make Douglas the favorite tree for many growers. Prefers fertile, well-drained, light soil with full sun.

OTHER

NEW**Red Rhubarb \$5.00 ea.**

Victoria - Heirloom variety. Slender red/green stalks can be harvested after the first year. Excellent for cooking and baking.

Asparagus**5/\$5.00**

Jersey Supreme - Early season, high yield, cold hardy, disease resistance.

Horseradish \$3.00 ea.rich in Vitamin C - Adds ZIP to Sauces, Dips and Spreads
Can be grown in a container.

TREES AND FLOWERING SHRUBS

Black Cherry (*Prunus serotina*) **\$3.00 ea.** **24-36"**

Valuable timber which can be planted in open or as underplanting. Does well in wide variety of soil types. Good species for wildlife food.

Spicebush (*Lindera benzoin*) **\$3.00 ea.** **18-24"**

Also known as allspice, grows to 15', producing a berry ripening in August and September which is eaten by game birds.

White Oak (*Quercus alba*) **\$3.00 ea.** **18-24"**

Broad, round dense head, spreading branches and purple-red Fall color. Leaves remain on tree for Winter interest, bark light gray and flaked.

Buttonbush (*Cephalanthus occidentalis*) **\$3.00 ea.** **24-36"**

A native to the Eastern United States that will thrive in wet and low-lying areas. Blooms July and August with cream colored flowers that develop into nutlet type fruits, remaining on into the winter. Matures to 6-12 feet.

American Redbud (*Cercis canadensis*) **\$3.00 ea.** **18-24"**

A small flat-topped tree, producing pink blooms on bare stems in early spring. Foliage is large and heart-shape, changing to yellow in the fall. Does well in a protected location.

Chinese Chestnut (*Castanea mollissima*) **\$2.50ea.** **12-18"**

Grown in a nursery from seed of selected strain. Hardy, blight-resistant, fast growing tree which bears nuts slightly larger than the now extinct American Chestnut. Plant two or more for pollination. Height at maturity about 30-35 feet.

NEW THIS YEAR **Grown in plastic pots!**

Willow, Dappled (*Salix integra*) **\$4.00 ea.** **8-10" in height**

Height and spread reach 3 to 5 feet. Its main attraction is the tri-color leaves of white, green and pink. We advise periodic trimming to maintain leaf variegation. Tolerates wet conditions. Leaf color stays better in full sun.

Rhododendron Dwarf PJM Lavender **\$4.00 ea.** **6-8" in height**

Height and spread 3 to 6 feet. A semi-dwarf rhododendron with small evergreen foliage. Small bright lavender pink flowers in early spring. Compact growth habit, will not get out of hand. Good for under low windows.
